
# THE PROGRAM



# THE VISITORS' CENTER AND OUTDOOR THEATRE

#### **CONCEPT ILLUSTRATIONS**



- 1. The location of the visitors' center is to the east of the chapel in respectable distance. the main axis of the chapel dictates the coordination of the new structures.
- 2. Over the trench of the old city wall is the main entrypoint to the building - resembling the bgidge one had to cross to enter the town. Once one has crossed, the chapel comes in full view.
- 3. The theatre follows the geometry of the new building. Breaking this geometry in a tall, curved stone wall - also the back wall of the theatre.
- 4. Lean wooden beams provide shade which is crucial hence the site is southern France. The side porch - directly accesible from the exhibition space inside provides a space to relax and enjoy the view.


## THE FUNCTIONS


As listed below the visitors' center's main function is an exhibition area where art exhibitions can be hosted or information on the chapel's history can be placed. All the other spaces are service areas, small, since space is limited - restrooms, dressing rooms for the performers and a storage space.

The exhibition area has large windows and french doors open to the side porch running along the western facade. This provides the perfect opportunity for rest and taking in the view of the chapel.

The outdoor theatre on the other side of the stone wall is also shaded with the same wooden beams. The theatre itself can sit about 165 people but there is vast open green space in the park behind and around if need be. The park itself contains some low-maintenance walking paths, and some low-raise vegetation in the end closing with tall cipruses literally closing the circle.
